ASME Y14.5 2009 Standard Update - Webinar

Two Half-Day Seminar (0.8 CEU's)

Course Description

This course discusses the changes made in the 2009 version of the ASME Y14.5 standard from the 1994 version. While, in general, the 2009 standard adds to the 1994 version, an overview of all the changes is covered. Material will be covered in two 4-hour sessions on two different days. The first and last 30 minutes of each session will be for questions and answers.

Objectives

1. Introduce the new symbology of the 2009 standard.
2. Demonstrate the changes to, and clarifications of, definitions from the 1994 standard.
3. Aid in your understanding of how/when the new version affects your drawings.

Who Should Attend

This program is designed for anyone already familiar with the 1994 version of the standard and are preparing to change, or contemplating changing, their current specifications to the 2009 version of the standard.

Program Description

The ASME Y14.5-2009 standard generally adds new tools or symbols to what already exists in the 1994 version.

The AGI overview presentation of the 2009 update briefly discusses each one of the seven “new” symbols and provides some additional application slides.

Because the 2009 standard mainly adds clarification and new tolerancing tools (symbols and definitions), drawings completed to the 1994 version will still be compliant with the 2009 standard.

Prerequisites

This is **NOT** a beginner program! Attendees should already have a thorough understanding of the majority of the ASME Y14.5 1994 Standard before attending this program. In fact, most of the differences between the 1994 and the 2009 standard apply to advanced, but potentially common, concepts.
